### **Community Affairs**

### **Functions:**

- C- To trigger dialogue with the social economy sector. Our main goal is to improve the relationship between the university and the community in terms of technology, services and applied regional development.

**Lines of Action:**

Our University has devised Programs, Projects and Activities in accordance with our goals. Such actions must match the guidelines established by the Community Affairs Office and be approved by the Academic Units.

Community Programs have long-term goals, deal with the thematic areas concerning our community's most important emerging issues, and seek to strengthen the relationship between the University and other social sectors. They include at least two (2) projects or activities. Their maximum duration is three (3) years.

Community Projects link the University and other social sectors, and have mid term goals. Their maximum duration is one (1) year.

Community Activities are designed for specific interaction with the community, and have short-term goals. Their duration is 1 or 2 days.

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
